

## Do students need to bring their own computer to attend UGA?

Many students bring a computer with them or buy one after they arrive on campus, but there is no university requirement to own a computer. If you want to buy a computer to supplement those that the university provides for students, you can check with your advisor or other instructors to see if your college or department recommends a particular kind of computer for classes in your field.

EITS operates several Windows computer labs with direct Internet connection. The labs also include word processing, spreadsheet software, graphics software, web browsers, and connection to UGA computing systems. At most of the labs, EITS staff can assist you with basic computer use. Specialized hardware and software for visually impaired or motor skills impaired students are provided at some labs.

In addition to the labs that EITS operates for all students, every college and many departments provide computer labs for students to use. Your advisor or instructors can provide information about specific computing labs that are available for classes.

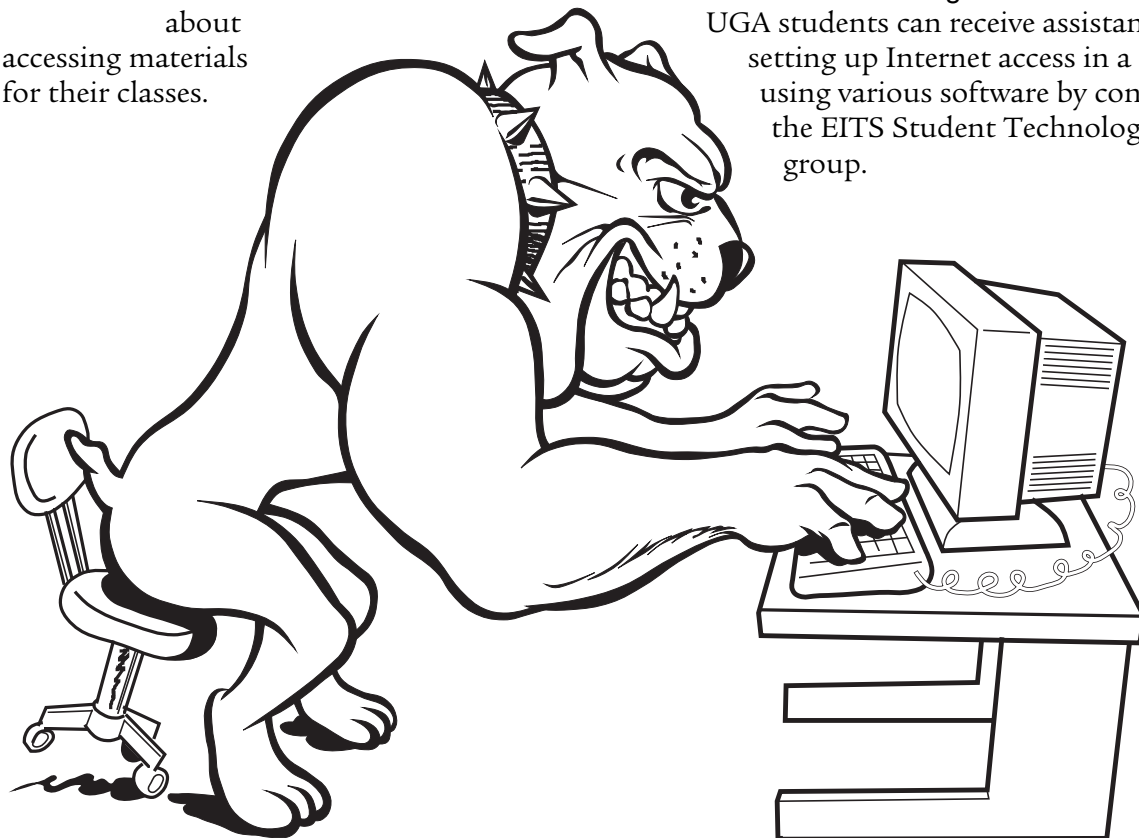
